### **Citation for the Admission of Ken Fink-Jensen into the Paul Harris Fellowship by the Rotary Club of Wellington at the President's Dinner, 2 June 2011, President Colleen Singleton presiding**

Kenneth Fink-Jensen joined the Rotary Club of Wellington on 28 June 2004. He has been a member of the Fellowship Committee and a member and Chair of the Vocational Services Committee. He has also served as a Board Director.

Kenneth Fink-Jensen has promoted the Club's relationship with the Victoria University of Wellington Skilled Migrants Programme and co-ordinated the migrants with mentors, which is critical to the success of this programme.

The Club has an involvement with a number of external philanthropic organisations. Kenneth has been a member and Chair of the J R McKenzie Youth Education Fund, which makes small grants to individuals and families for children's education-related costs; for shoes, uniforms and school fees for families having difficulty meeting basic costs. In the year to March 2011 the Fund received 302 applications for a total of \$90,608 and made grants worth \$76, 807.

Rotary also has a relationship with Outward Bound in that a member of our Club manages applications from secondary school students for scholarships to attend Outward Bound courses. Kenneth is managing the processing of the applications.

To ensure that as many people as possible have the opportunity to apply for grants from both of these organisation Kenneth has gone out to schools to make sure they know these grants are available.
